<u>Key Verse</u>: "'And these are the garments which they shall make: a breastplate, an ephod, a robe, a skillfully woven tunic, a turban, and a sash. So they shall make holy garments for Aaron your brother and his sons, that he may minister to Me as priest." (Ex. 28:4)

- F. The High Priest wore a turban (mitre) (28:36-38)
- G. The High Priest wore a sash (girdle) (28:39)
- H. Aaron's sons wore special clothes (28:40-43)
  - 1. They wore coats
  - 2. They wore sashes (girdles)
  - 3. They wore caps (bonnets)
  - 4. They wore linen trousers

- A. The grain offering was prepared (29:1-3)
- B. The priests were prepared (29:4-9)
- C. The sin offering was made (29:10-14)

- F. The wave offerings were given (29:23-30)
  - 1. The loaf, cake, and wafer were waved.
  - 2. The breast of ram was waved.

# <u>Lesson 13</u>: <u>The Tabernacle Workmen</u> (Exodus 30-31)

<u>Key Verse</u>: "See, I have called by name Bezaleel the son of Uri, the son of Hur, of the tribe of Judah. And I have filled him with the Spirit of God, in wisdom, in understanding, in knowledge, and in all manner of workmanship." (Ex. 31:2-3)

- E. Moses received the plans for the incense (30:34-38)
- II. The Tabernacle Workers Were Appointed (Ex. 31)
  - A. The workers were appointed their duties (31:1-11)
    - 1. Bezaleel was appointed to his duties (1-5)
    - 2. Aholiab was appointed to his duties (6-11)
    - 3. They were given the Spirit of wisdom (3, 6)
  - B. The Sabbath was reemphasized (31:12-18)
    - 1. It is a sign to every generation (12-13)

- II. Moses Erected the Tabernacle (Ex. 40)
  - A. The LORD commanded the Tabernacle be erected (40:1-8)
  - B. The LORD commanded the Tabernacle be consecrated (40:9-16)
  - C. Moses had the Tabernacle erected (40:17-32)
    - 1. They erected the tabernacle (17-19)
    - 2. They placed the furnishings (20-32)
  - D. Moses had the court erected (40:33)
  - E. The LORD's cloud covered the Tabernacle (40:34-38)
