 - a. He declared a curse on the priests (1-2)
 - b. He rebuked their descendants because they have broken the Levitical covenant (3-6)
 - c. He made them contemptible because they have departed from His ways (7-9)
 - B. Charge Two: Their men have broken their marriage vows (2:10-16)
 - 1. They have married pagan wives (10-12)
 - 2. They have caused their wives great sorrow (13)
 - 3. They deny the charge (14a)
 - 4. Proof: They have broken their marriage covenant (14b-16)
 - a. They broke the covenant of which the LORD was witness (14b)
 - b. They frustrated the LORD's purpose (15)
 - -The LORD made them one
 - -The LORD sought a "holy seed"
 - -The LORD regards divorce as treachery
 - c. The LORD hates divorce (16)

- C. Charge Three: The people say the LORD is unjust (2:17-3:5)
 - 1. They weary the LORD with their words (2:17)
 - 2. The people deny the charge (17)
 - 3. Proof: They say the LORD delights in evil doers (17)
 - 4. Justice will be rendered in the Day of the LORD (3:1-5)
 - a. The Messianic Messenger will come (1)
 - b. He will purge the Levites (2-3)
 - c. He will bring just judgment to the people (4-5)
